FC Dynamo Kyiv coach Valeri Gazzaev is seeking a change of luck when FC Internazionale Milano visit the Ukrainian capital on Matchday 4.

- Dynamo's Russian coach has lost home ties in Europe to both Inter and their coach José Mourinho in the past but he will hope his charges can produce another impressive home performance to match the 3-1 victory against FC Rubin Kazan in September.
- In striker Andriy Shevchenko, Gazzaev has a player with experience of eliminating Inter from the UEFA Champions League while at AC Milan – and Shevchenko will not be short on motivation against opponents led by his old Chelsea FC manager Mourinho.
- The Ukrainian side will be further buoyed by their impressive 2-2 draw in Italy in the most recent round of matches having led twice and now lie second in the section, one point and two places above the Italian champions.

### Previous meetings

- Inter and Dynamo met in the 2003/04 UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Christian Vieri's 90th-minute header earned Inter a 2-1 victory at San Siro on 30 September 2003 but it was Dynamo's turn to strike late in the return in Kyiv on 10 December, Diogo Rincón's 85th-minute goal cancelling out an Adani effort. The draw did not suit either team, however, for each had needed to win to reach the last 16.

### Match background

- Dynamo's most recent visit from Italian opposition brought a 4-1 home defeat by AS Roma in the 2007/08 group stage.
- Their solitary win in eight previous attempts was a 2-0 success against Roma in the 2004/05 group stage courtesy of a Traianos Dellas own goal and Maxim Shatskikh strike.
- Besides their 1-1 draw with Dynamo in 2003, Inter have visited Ukraine on only one other occasion – for a 2-0 victory at FC Shakhtar Donetsk in the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round. Obafemi Martins and Adriano hit the second-half goals that set Inter on their way to a 3-1 aggregate triumph.
- Inter have won just one of their last six UEFA Champions League away matches.

### Team ties

- Shevchenko twice played a key role in knocking Inter out of the UEFA Champions League. The Dynamo striker scored the 'away' goal when Milan defeated Inter in the 2002/03 semi-final en route to winning the trophy. The teams drew 0-0 then 1-1 at San Siro, with Inter eliminated as they were the designated home side for that second leg.
- He also struck in both legs of the Milan clubs' UEFA Champions League quarter-final contest in 2004/05. After helping Milan earn a 2-0 first-leg win, he put the Rossoneri ahead in the return although it was subsequently abandoned because of crowd trouble with Milan awarded a 3-0 victory.

- Shevchenko registered eight goals in Milan derbies in Serie A and another three against Inter in the Coppa Italia during his first seven-season spell at San Siro.
- His first strike against the Nerazzurri came on his derby debut on 23 October 1999, a 28th-minute opening goal as Milan won the 'away' fixture 2-1.
- Coaches Gazzaev and Mourinho crossed paths five years ago in the UEFA Champions League when the former's PFC CSKA Moskva side met Mourinho's Chelsea. The London club won the Matchday 3 meeting 2-0 on 20 October 2004, and then prevailed 1-0 in Moscow on Matchday 4, eventually finishing top of the group with CSKA third.
- Gazzaev was at the helm of the CSKA side beaten home and away by Inter in the 2007/08 group stage, going down 2-1 in Russia and 4-2 in Italy. He had previously led CSKA past Parma FC in the 2004/05 UEFA Cup semi-finals en route to winning the trophy. CSKA drew 0-0 away then won 3-0 in Moscow.
- Gazzaev also oversaw FC Dinamo Moskva's victory against Torino FC in the 1992/93 UEFA Cup second round.
- Dynamo players Oleksandr Shovkovskiy, Andriy Neshchey, Oleg Gusev, Artem Milevskiy and Shevchenko were all in the Ukraine team beaten 3-0 by Italy in the 2006 FIFA World Cup quarter-finals.

- Valeri Gazzaev made two changes to the side which lost to FC Shakhtar Donetsk in the Ukrainian Cup three days earlier, Oleh Gusev and Denys Garmash replacing Artem Kravets and the suspended Ognjen Vukojević.
- The draw ended Dynamo's six-match winning run in the Premier League though they are unbeaten at home since losing 2-1 to FC Porto in the UEFA Champions League on 5 November 2008, a run of 21 games.
- Dynamo have scored in each of their last 27 league fixtures, since a 1-0 loss at Shakhtar on 16 November 2008.
- Gusev is the only Dynamo player to have featured in every league and European game this season.
- Gazzaev's side lost 2-0 at Shakhtar in the Ukrainian Cup quarter-finals on 28 October, the visitors ending with ten men following Vukojević's 85th-minute dismissal. The midfielder was subsequently dealt a three-game suspension.
- Andriy Shevchenko scored a penalty in his first match after returning to the club, a 3-1 home victory over FC Metalurh Donetsk on 31 August. His subsequent strikes, against FC Arsenal Kyiv and FC Obolon Kyiv, were winning goals.
- Dynamo beat FC Vorskla Poltava 4-2 on penalties in the Ukrainian Super Cup on 11 July following a goalless draw.

- Inter have scored 197 goals in the European Champion Clubs' Cup, 447 goals in UEFA club competition overall.

### **UEFA Champions League statistics**

- Inter have collected nine yellow cards, the joint highest total in the competition with AC Milan and Real Madrid CF.
- Mario Balotelli is available again after a one-game ban following his red card on Matchday 2, although Maicon and Cristian Chivu are both within a booking of a suspension.

### **Latest domestic information**

- José Mourinho made five changes to the side that beat US Città di Palermo on Thursday, but the result was the same as Inter claimed a fifth successive Serie A win. Rene Krhin made his first start for Inter but was replaced by Samuel Eto'o at half-time as Mourinho switched to two up front.
- With Juventus and Sampdoria both failing to win, Inter extended their lead at the Serie A summit to seven points – a record after eleven games since the division switched to three points for a win in 1994/95.
- Diego Milito's strike was his seventh in nine league appearances for Inter, and his 31st in 40 Serie A matches for the Nerazzurri and Genoa CFC.
- Inter survived a scare against Palermo at San Siro on 29 October, eventually winning 5-3 after racing into a 4-0 half-time lead thanks to two goals apiece from Eto'o and Balotelli. Yet Palermo hit back with three in 18 second-half minutes before fit-again Milito made the points safe late on.
- It was the second time Mourinho's side have scored five goals this season having won 5-0 at Genoa on 17 October. The last time Inter had hit five at home was in a 5-0 defeat of Livorno on 16 October 2005.
- Palermo are the first side to score more than once against Inter in a Serie A game this term.
- Javier Zanetti made his 477th league appearance for the Nerazzurri against Palermo, surpassing Giacinto Facchetti to move second on the club's all-time list behind Giuseppe Bergomi (519). Zanetti has not missed a Serie A game since 28 October 2006, a run of 141 consecutive matches.
- Iván Córdoba made his 400th appearance for the club in the same game.
- A goal apiece from Sulley Muntari – his first of the campaign – and Wesley Sneijder helped Inter to a 2-1 victory over Calcio Catania on 24 October.
- Mourinho has not lost a home league fixture since 23 February 2002 when SC Beira-Mar beat his FC Porto side 3-2, 123 games ago.
- The Italian titleholders' last home league defeat was a 2-1 loss to Juventus in March 2008. The Nerazzurri have since won 21 and drawn seven.

- Muntari was taken off on 29 minutes against Livorno, and Mourinho said "he couldn't actually walk" after the game.
- Milito and Motta returned as second-half substitutes against Palermo yet while Milito subsequently started at Livorno, Motta is still struggling for fitness.

### **Miscellaneous**

- Mourinho's assistant, André Villas Boas, has left Inter to take over as head coach of Portuguese Liga strugglers A. Académica de Coimbra. Boas, who worked with Mourinho at Porto and Chelsea FC, signed a two-year deal for what is his first senior coaching role and, at 31, is the youngest coach in the league.
- Eto'o has been shortlisted for the FIFA World Player of the Year award to be announced in Zurich on 21 December.
- Inter signed FC Twente's Marko Arnautovic on loan in August but he is not in their UEFA Champions League squad.

- A forward, Gazzaev scored four goals in eight games for the Soviet Union, won the 1984 USSR Cup with Dinamo Moskva and – having played for his local side under their former name, Spartak Ordzhonikidze – coached Alania Vladikavkaz to the 1995 Russian title.
- Joined CSKA in 2001, winning the 2002 Russian Cup but missing out on the league in a play-off against FC Lokomotiv Moskva. Undeterred, his side romped to the title in 2003.
- Led CSKA and Russia in tandem in 2002 and 2003, resigning as national team boss after UEFA EURO 2004™ qualifying defeats by Albania and Georgia.
- Returning to CSKA in 2004 after a break from football, he won the 2005 Russian Cup, the 2005 and 2006 Premier-Liga titles and masterminded Russia's first UEFA club competition triumph as CSKA beat Sporting Clube de Portugal 3-1 in the 2004/05 UEFA Cup final in Lisbon.
- Replaced Yuri Semin as Dynamo coach in summer 2009 after resigning as CSKA boss at the end of 2008.

### **FC Internazionale Milano: José Mourinho**

- A former teacher, he worked as a translator for Sporting Clube de Portugal coach Sir Bobby Robson in the 1990s, eventually following the Englishman to Porto and Barcelona as a coaching assistant.
- As coach, had a nine-game spell at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before getting his big break with Porto in January 2002.
- In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in the final in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 as successor to Claudio Ranieri and led the club to their first league championship for 50 years and the League Cup in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007.
- Left Chelsea by mutual agreement in September 2007 and stayed out of football until joining Inter in June 2008. His first campaign saw the Nerazzurri retain their Serie A title but they bowed out to eventual finalists Manchester United FC in the UEFA Champions League first knockout round.

## Competition facts

---

### • **UEFA Champions League:** Group stage milestones

Holders FC Barcelona are looking to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/00 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos CFP on Matchday 1 at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in the 2006/07 season at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6.

Laurent Blanc is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 36 years and 339 days, having found the net for Manchester United FC in their 3-2 defeat of Olympiacos CFP on 23 October 2002.

Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

Barcelona, Manchester United and Milan have all finished as group winners on ten occasions, one more than Real Madrid and Juventus.

Four teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96) and Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage).

In 2006/07, PFC Levski Sofia joined 1. FC Košice in being the only team to have played in the UEFA Champions League and never picked up a point. The Slovakian side have not returned to the competition since losing all six games in their only campaign to date in 1997/98. Six other teams have gone through a single group stage campaign without picking up a point: FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06) and RSC Anderlecht (2004/05) plus Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively) and Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage).

Manchester United scored 20 goals in the 1998/99 group stage, more than any other side has managed. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage.

Dynamo conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2007/08, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Ferencvárosi TC in the 1995/96 campaign.

No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea FC (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06) and Villarreal CF (2005/06) all let in just one.

Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on Matchday 6 of the 2006/07 campaign, FC Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on Matchday 3 of the same campaign.

The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before Bayer Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
