FC Zürich registered one of the surprise results of the UEFA Champions League when Hannu Tihinen's early goal gave them a 1-0 win away to AC Milan on 30 September but two home defeats mean the Swiss champions are in need of another three points on their travels against Olympique de Marseille.

- Gabriel Heinze scored the only goal in the 69th minute on Matchday 3 in Zurich to give Marseille their first win in Group C and take them above their opponents and into third place in the section.

### Match background

- This is the fourth time Marseille have played host to a team from Switzerland in a competitive match and they have not yet tasted defeat, winning two and drawing one of the three fixtures. However, in beating FC Sion 3-1 in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup second round and BSC Young Boys 2-1 in the UEFA Intertoto Cup third round in 2005, the French club had to come from behind on each occasion.

- Marseille are unbeaten in their last six meetings with Swiss opponents, home and away, since losing their first fixture, a 2-0 defeat at FC Sion in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup second round.
- This is the first time Zürich have played a competitive away game against French opponents having recorded a win and a defeat in their two home games.
- The Swiss side have won all three away games in this season's UEFA Champions League and are yet to concede a goal. Prior to their triumph in Milan, Zürich were victorious at NK Maribor in the third qualifying round and FK Ventspils in the play-offs, winning both games 3-0.
- After losing their Matchday 1 contest at the Stade Vélodrome 2-1 to Milan, Marseille are anxious to improve their home record in Europe's premier club competition. In each of their last three UEFA Champions League group-stage campaigns OM have only been victorious in one of their three home games, losing four of those nine matches.
- Their success in Switzerland on Matchday 3 ended OM's run of six successive away defeats in the UEFA Champions League proper since winning 1-0 at Liverpool FC in their first tie on the road in 2007/08.

#### Team ties

- Zürich's Onyekachi Okonkwo and Marseille striker Bakari Koné both came on as substitutes as the Ivory Coast beat Nigeria 1-0 during the 2008 CAF Africa Cup of Nations group stage.
- While at Valencia CF, Fernando Morientes came up against FC Salzburg in the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round second leg. Having lost 1-0 away, Morientes's strike helped the Liga outfit to a 3-1 aggregate success in the return. Johan Vonlanthen was a second-half substitute for Salzburg.
- Vonlanthen and Salzburg also faced Brandão, who was then at FC Shakhtar Donetsk, in another third qualifying round tie the following season. Brandão scored the decisive goal in Shakhtar's 3-2 aggregate triumph.

- Marseille have scored 49 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.

- Souleymane Diawara is available again after serving a one-game suspension following his red card on Matchday 2, although Laurent Bonnart is banned after being dismissed in Zurich.

- Garry Bocaly started on the right of defence against Toulouse for his first appearance of the season.
- Benoît Cheyrou had played every minute of Marseille's league campaign until missing out on the match with a groin injury. Goalkeeper Steve Mandanda is now the only player to have featured in all 900 minutes of Ligue 1 action this season, although Mamadou Niang has also played every game.
- The dismissal of Toulouse's Yohann Pelé after just eight minutes allowed Marseille to play against ten men for the second time this season, having beaten a depleted LOSC Lille Métropole side 1-0 on 16 August following Mathieu Debuchy's 64th-minute dismissal.
- Marseille have not triumphed against Toulouse since a 3-0 home win on 1 October 2006, drawing four and losing two of their last six encounters.
- OM have not kept a clean sheet at the Stade Vélodrome since holding titleholders FC Girondins de Bordeaux to a goalless draw on 30 August.
- Marseille are yet to lose a game in which Brandão has scored, winning on all ten previous occasions that the Brazilian had found the net for the club prior to the draw with Toulouse.
- Marseille's home fixture against Paris Saint-Germain FC on 25 October was postponed after an outbreak of swine flu caused the entire visiting squad to be quarantined for 72 hours. The match has been rearranged for 20 November.

- On 4 October, AS Monaco FC inflicted OM's first home league defeat of the season, winning 2-1 at the Stade Vélodrome. They had not triumphed in Marseille since 5 December 2003, when current Marseille coach Didier Deschamps guided the principality club to a 2-1 success.
- Deschamps' side follow the visit of Zürich with a league trip to fellow UEFA Champions League contenders and seven-time Ligue 1 winners Olympique Lyonnais on 8 November.

- Bernard Challandes made three changes to the team that drew 2-2 with FC Basel 1893 on 28 October, with Philippe Koch, Okonkwo and Alexandre Alphonse making way for Veli Lampi, Milan Gajić and Admir Mehmedi.
- Gajić's place in the starting lineup came after he had climbed off the bench and scored four minutes from time to salvage a point against Basel.
- Three days earlier, Challandes's side ended a run of three successive Super League defeats with a 3-1 win at FC St. Gallen. The victory was Zürich's first on the road in the league this term.
- Zürich will face Basel again in the third round of the Swiss Cup on 20 November.
- The Swiss titleholders have only kept three clean sheets in their last 14 games – against AC Milan and in Swiss Cup ties with FC Locarno and FC Witikon.
- Challandes's side have scored 12 of their 29 league goals this term between the 58th and 75th minutes.

- A product of Nantes' highly-rated youth system, had trophy success with Marseille as a defensive midfielder, winning the league in 1990 and 1992 and captaining them to UEFA Champions League success in 1993.
- Joined Juve in 1994 and went on to win the UEFA Champions League again in 1996, three Serie A titles, a Coppa Italia and a European/South American Cup. Left in 1999 for Chelsea, staying one season and winning the FA Cup, before ending career with a year in Valencia, watching from the bench as they lost the 2001 UEFA Champions League final to FC Bayern München.
- Captained France to victory on home soil in 1998 FIFA World Cup and at UEFA EURO 2000™, retiring that year with 103 caps.
- Started coaching career in 2001 with Monaco, winning the League Cup in 2003 and reaching the UEFA Champions League final in 2004, going down to José Mourinho's FC Porto. Resigned in September 2005 and joined his old club Juventus, then in Serie B, the following June. Resigned after securing promotion back to Serie A in May 2007.
- Appointed Marseille coach in May 2009, replacing Erik Gerets on a two-year contract.

### FC Zürich: Bernard Challandes

**Coaching career:** FC La Chaux-de-Fonds, FC Le Locle, Yverdon-Sport FC, BSC Young Boys, Servette FC, Switzerland Under-21, FC Zürich

- Bernard Challandes has quietly carved out an impressive coaching CV since his career started in earnest when he took over at Yverdon-Sport FC in 1987. He stayed in the post for seven seasons, winning four lower-league titles, before moving to BSC Young Boys.
- His stay in Berne proved nowhere near as lengthy or successful, however, Challandes departing in 1995 with the club finishing bottom of the 12-team Swiss top flight after collecting just 17 points all season.
- Challandes, however, remained in the Super League by taking charge of Servette FC, but again this was short-lived and there followed a lengthy spell out of the limelight before the Le Locle-native took over the Switzerland Under-21 side in 2001.
- The highlight of his six years in charge came in 2002, when a team including Alexander Frei, Ludovic Magnin and Daniel Gygyax reached the UEFA European Under-21 Championship semi-finals on home soil.
- The lure of club football proved too strong for Challandes, however, and in 2007 he took charge of FC Zürich, leading them to the UEFA Cup Round of 32 in his first season. A third league title in four years, and a new contract until 2012, followed in 2009, before securing UEFA Champions League group-stage football for the first time at the start of 2009/10.

• Craig Thomson has put the judgement he has acquired as a lawyer to good use to become a promising international referee.

• Thomson, who has been officiating since the age of 16 and counts golf, reading and cinema among his hobbies, made his first foray into international refereeing in spring 2003 when he took charge of two UEFA European Under-19 Championship Elite round fixtures.

• That September he refereed his first competitive U21 game and stepped up to the UEFA Champions League first qualifying round in summer 2004. Thomson made his FIFA World Cup qualifying debut in September 2004 and also featured in UEFA EURO 2008™ qualifying, subsequently acting as fourth official in three group matches at the final tournament.

• He officiated at three UEFA Cup matches in 2006/07 and took charge of two games at the 2007 UEFA European U21 Championship finals before making his UEFA Champions League group-stage debut when Rosenborg BK played Valencia CF in October 2007.

• Thomson also worked at the FIFA U-17 World Cup in the Korea Republic the same year, although his career highlights remain two 'Old Firm' games between Celtic FC and Rangers FC, the 2006/07 Scottish League Cup final and the 2009 Scottish Cup final.

## Competition facts

### • UEFA Champions League: Group stage milestones

Holders FC Barcelona are looking to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/00 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos CFP on Matchday 1 at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in the 2006/07 season at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6.

Laurent Blanc is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 36 years and 339 days, having found the net for Manchester United FC in their 3-2 defeat of Olympiacos CFP on 23 October 2002.

Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

Barcelona, Manchester United and Milan have all finished as group winners on ten occasions, one more than Real Madrid and Juventus.

Four teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96) and Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage).

In 2006/07, PFC Levski Sofia joined 1. FC Košice in being the only team to have played in the UEFA Champions League and never picked up a point. The Slovakian side have not returned to the competition since losing all six games in their only campaign to date in 1997/98. Six other teams have gone through a single group stage campaign without picking up a point: FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06) and RSC Anderlecht (2004/05) plus Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively) and Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage).

Manchester United scored 20 goals in the 1998/99 group stage, more than any other side has managed. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage.

Dynamo conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2007/08, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Ferencvárosi TC in the 1995/96 campaign.

No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea FC (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06) and Villarreal CF (2005/06) all let in just one.

Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on Matchday 6 of the 2006/07 campaign, FC Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on Matchday 3 of the same campaign.

The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before Bayer Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
