Match background

Galatasaray will be hoping for a repeat of their first home fixture in last season's UEFA Champions League as they welcome the early Group A leaders Paris Saint-Germain to Istanbul.

• While the Turkish team were held at Club Brugge in their opening game, Paris turned on the style with an impressive dismantling of Real Madrid to take the initiative in the section.

Previous meetings

- Galatasaray have won both previous home matches against Paris, in the 1996/97 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup second round (4-2) and the 2000/01 UEFA Champions League second group stage (1-0).
- Both games in France also ended in home wins; Paris turned round that 1996 tie against Galatasaray coached then, as now, by Fatih Terim with a 4-0 success (6-4 aggregate) and also won 2-0 in March 2001. It was the Turkish club who went through to that season's UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, however, with Paris fourth in Group B; Galatasaray were beaten 5-3 by Real Madrid in the last eight (3-2 h, 0-3 a).

Form guide Galatasaray

- Held 0-0 at Club Brugge on matchday one, Galatasaray are without a win in their last eight European fixtures (D3 L5).
- Galatasaray kicked off their 2018/19 UEFA Champions League group campaign with a 3-0 home success against Lokomotiv Moskva, but picked up only one more point in their next five fixtures to finish third behind Porto and Schalke. They then lost to Benfica in the UEFA Europa League round of 32 (1-2 h, 0-0 a).
- The defeat of Lokomotiv is Galatasaray's only win in their last 16 European fixtures (D6 L9).
- The win against Loko ended a run of three successive home 1-1 draws in Europe for Galatasaray, who have won only two of their last 13 continental fixtures in Istanbul, drawing six.
- Galatasaray are unbeaten in their last six home matches against French clubs (W4 D2) and have lost only once against Ligue 1 visitors in Istanbul, a 2-0 reverse against Monaco in the 1993/94 UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Turkish champions in 2018/19 for a record 22nd time, Galatasaray qualified for a 16th appearance in the UEFA Champions League group stage one more than all other Turkish teams combined.
- Galatasaray are the only team from Turkey to have reached a European Cup semi-final, in 1989.

Paris

- On matchday one Ángel Di María's two goals helped Paris to a 3-0 defeat of Real Madrid, their fifth matchday one success in their last eight UEFA Champions League campaigns.
- Ligue 1 champions for the sixth time in seven years in 2018/19, and eighth time overall, this is the French side's eighth successive UEFA Champions League campaign.
- Semi-finalists in 1995, Paris have been knocked out in the round of 16 in the last three seasons having been eliminated in the quarter-finals in the four previous campaigns.
- In 2018/19, Paris finished first in a section including eventual champions Liverpool, Napoli and Crvena zvezda, and looked set to reach the quarter-finals after a 2-0 first-leg victory at Manchester United in the round of 16, only to bow out on away goals following a 3-1 home defeat.
- Paris picked up four points on their travels in Group C last season, losing at Liverpool (2-3) and drawing at Napoli (1-1) before a 4-1 victory at Crvena zvezda on matchday six. They also won 2-0 at Manchester United in the round of 16 first leg but have recorded only four victories in their last ten away UEFA Champions League fixtures (D2 L4).
- The Parisian side have lost three of their four games in Turkey, although they were victorious in their last such encounter, 2-1 at Kayserispor in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup first round first leg, winning by the same aggregate score.
- Paris have won only five of their last 12 UEFA Champions League matches (D2 L5), although they have scored in 25 consecutive games in the competition.

- Ryan Donk and Sofiane Feghouli both made their 50th appearances in UEFA club competition on matchday one.
- Galatasaray have nine points after six league matches this season, and drew 0-0 at home to Fenerbahçe on Saturday. It was their third successive draw in all competitions.
- That made it 39 home league games unbeaten for Galatasaray (W32 D7), whose last defeat came against Kasımpasa on 6 May 2017.
- Galatasaray have scored only twice in their last five league matches, and have nine points after six games their worst start to a league campaign since 1989/90, when they had seven points at the same stage.
- Cimbom kicked off the new season with a 1-0 win against Akhisarspor in the Turkish Super Cup on 7 August, winning the trophy for a record 16th time.
- Florin Andone made his first appearance for Galatasaray in a 1-1 draw against Malatyaspor on 22 September.
- Radamel Falcao marked his Galatasaray debut with the only goal in the defeat of Kasımpaşa on 13 September.

- Younès Belhanda suffered a broken jaw in this season's game against Kasımpaşa, returning to action against Fenerbahçe.
- Emre Akbaba has been left out of the UEFA Champions League squad after suffering a broken leg against Rizespor on 11 May; he is expected to be sidelined until next year.

- Ángel Di María made his 100th appearance in UEFA club competition on matchday one, marking it with his 25th and 26th European goals. Juan Bernat's next appearance will be his 50th.
- Julian Draxler has played 49 matches in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.
- Neymar, who was suspended for the first three Ligue 1 games, scored late winning goals in his first three appearance for Paris this season, 1-0 victories at home to Strasbourg on 14 September, at Lyon on 22 September and at Bordeaux on Saturday.
- Neymar has scored 37 goals in 41 Ligue 1 appearances for Paris, who have never lost a league game in which the Brazilian has found the net (W25 D3).
- Paris suffered a second Ligue 1 defeat of the season on 25 September, going down 2-0 at home to Reims. It was the first time in 45 league games they had failed to score, since a goalless draw at Caen on the final day of the 2017/18 season, and their first league defeat at the Parc des Princes since a 2-0 loss to Rennes on 12 May 2018. Their record in between those two home defeats was W20 D2.
- Keylor Navas conceded his first goal for Paris after 298 minutes without being beaten.
- Rennes, who beat Paris on penalties in last season's French Cup final, defeated them again on 18 August in Brittany in Ligue 1, winning 2-1.
- Paris did not suffer their second league defeat in 2018/19 until the 31st round of matches.
- Paris have won their other six league games this season, scoring 12 goals without conceding.
- Paris won the French Super Cup on 3 August, defeating French Cup winners Rennes 2-1 thanks to goals from Kylian Mbappé and Di María. It was Paris's ninth win in the competition and their seventh in a row, a new record.
- Mbappé (out since 25 August, left hamstring) came on as a substitute on Saturday; Edinson Cavani (25 August, hip), Draxler (18 August, foot) and Thilo Kehrer (11 August, foot) have all been sidelined.
- Mauro Icardi has not played since matchday one due to a hamstring problem, although he was an unused substitute on Saturday.
- Éric-Maxim Choupo-Moting left the pitch in the first half against Reims with rib pains after colliding with Neymar and did not feature at Bordeaux.

- A central defender, Terim represented Galatasaray for over a decade, winning three Turkish caps, and played 51 games for Turkey, 32 as captain. Began his coaching career with Ankaragücü and Göztepe, before being named assistant to national team boss Sepp Piontek and put in charge of the U21s in 1990.
- Appointed Turkey coach in 1993, Terim led them to EURO '96. They lost all their matches in England, but just getting to the final tournament, Turkey's first since the 1954 FIFA World Cup, was a major landmark.
- Returned to Galatasaray after the EURO, winning four league titles, two domestic cups and the 2000 UEFA Cup. Serie A came calling and Terim took the helm at Fiorentina and Milan before rejoining Galatasaray; however, a run of disappointing results brought about a temporary retirement in 2004.
- Reappointed Turkey coach in 2005, Terim known as 'İmparator' (The Emperor) for his leadership skills steered them to the UEFA EURO 2008 semi-finals but could not guide them to the World Cup in either 2006 or 2010, the latter prompting his departure.
- Back for a third spell as Galatasaray boss in July 2011, in his first season he inspired Cimbom to their first Süper Lig crown in four years. Repeated the feat in 2013 when also helping Galatasaray to the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals. Named head of the national team for a third time on a part-time basis in August 2013, he parted company with Galatasaray a month later to assume the role full time. Was unable to lead Turkey to the 2014 World Cup, but did take them to UEFA EURO 2016. Took over at Galatasaray once again in December 2017, ending that season with another league title 12 months later, Terim guided Galatasaray to their seventh Turkish league and cup double and third under his command.

Thomas Tuchel

- Tuchel had a fairly undistinguished playing career, retiring prematurely in 1998 due to injury. His first off-pitch role was with the Stuttgart youth team. He subsequently joined Augsburg, where he coached the U19s and reserve sides as well as serving as academy coordinator.
- Tuchel moved to Mainz in 2008 and was initially in charge of the U19s, whom he led to a German title. A year after joining the club, Tuchel succeeded Jørn Andersen as coach of the senior team. He went on to help the club qualify twice for the UEFA Europa League, though Mainz were eliminated at the third qualifying round stage on both occasions.
- He took over from Jürgen Klopp in the Dortmund dugout prior to the 2015/16 campaign and led his side to the UEFA Europa League quarter-finals, where they came up against Klopp's Liverpool team and lost 5-4 on aggregate.
- Dortmund fared well under Tuchel in the Bundesliga in 2015/16, racking up 78 points to finish second behind Bayern München and qualify automatically for the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League group stage. They were also beaten by Bayern in the German Cup final in Tuchel's debut season.
- Tuchel's first coaching honour followed in 2016/17, Dortmund overcoming Eintracht Frankfurt 3-1 in the German Cup final in what proved to be his last match in charge; he left the club three days later and returned to football 12 months later, signing a two-year deal to replace Unai Emery at Paris and winning the club's second successive league title in his first season in charge to earn a contract extension until 2021.
